sacred sites sacred places explores the concept of sacred and what it means and implies to people in differing cultures it looks at why people regard some parts of the land as special and why this ascription remains constant in some cultures and changes in others archaeologists legislators and those involved in heritage management sometimes encounter conflict with local populations over sacred sites with the aid of over 70 illustrations the book examines the extreme importance of such sacred places in all cultures and the necessity of accommodating those intimate beliefs which are such a vital part of ongoing cultural identity sacred sites sacred places therefore will be of help to those who wish to be non destructive in their conservation and excavation practices this book is unique in attempting to describe the belief systems surrounding the existence of sacred sites and at the same time bringing such beliefs and practices into relationship with the practical problems of everyday heritage management the geographical coverage of the book is exceptionally wide and its variety of contributors including indigenous peoples archaeologists and heritage professionals is unrivalled in any other publication

how sacred sites amplify the energies of consciousness the earth and the universe examines the web of geometrical patterns linking sacred sites worldwide with special focus on the sacred network of ley lines in paris unveils the coming state of shared consciousness for humanity fueled by the sacred network reveals how consciousness is a tangible form of energy first marked by the standing stones

of our megalithic ancestors the world's sacred sites are not only places of spiritual energy but also hubs of cosmic energy and earthly energy generation upon generation has recognized the power of these sites with the result that each dominant culture builds their religious structures on the same spots the cathedral of notre dame in paris for example was constructed over a temple to diana that in turn had been built over a stone pillar worshipped by the gauls in the sacred network chris hardy shows how the world's sacred sites coincide with the intersections of energetic waves from the earth's geomagnetic field and how via their megaliths temples and steeples these sites act as antennae for the energies of the cosmos delving deeply in to paris's sacred network she also explores the intricate geometrical patterns created by the alignments of churches and monuments such as pentagrams and stars of david revealing that consciousness is a tangible energy she explains how the sacred network is fueling an 8 000 year evolutionary cycle initiated by our megalithic ancestors that will soon culminate in a new state of shared consciousness for humanity

this book presents current research in the political ecology of indigenous revival and its role in nature conservation in critical areas in the americas an important contribution to evolving studies on conservation of sacred natural sites the book elucidates the complexity of development scenarios within cultural landscapes related to the appropriation of religion environmental change in indigenous territories and new conservation management approaches indigeneity and the sacred explores how these struggles for land rights and political power are embedded within physical landscapes and how indigenous identity is reconstituted as globalizing forces simultaneously threaten and promote the notion of indigeneity

over a 3 day weekend in the spring of 2004 a group of scientists interested in extending understanding of place as applied in recreation research and management convened a working session in portland oregon the purpose of the gathering was to clarify their understanding of place related concepts approaches to the study of people place relations and the application of that understanding in recreation management for the purpose of integrating perspectives from different disciplines discussing approaches to understanding and measuring sense of place and other questions around the study and application of place related concepts topics that generated the most discussion included how social processes influence place meanings how place meanings are shared and negotiated within social groups and when and how place meanings and attachments focus reduce or avert conflict in natural resource planning and management this collection of papers is a result of that meeting

this book is based on an extensive field work in which the author tried to study the customary law of property of an african agrarian tribal community of [uma also known as nyima] of the nuba mountains in the northern sudan the writer has tried to explain the nature of property holding in the light of the people s philosophy evidenced in their social structure and their traditional beliefs special attention is paid to the traditional structure of political leadership in this highly segmented society that was prone not only to inter tribal wars but was also in a constant fission and fusion among themselves when not at war with other neighboring tribes in discussing jurisdictional issues and traditional settlement mechanisms based partly on law and custom both adopted by this egalitarian society the study is made currently relevant by keen observation on the effect of modernity on

traditional ethics and morality of the Ġma society that was once described by some authors as being impervious to foreign influence furthermore the reception and assimilation of the state law together with the shari ah laws in various areas such as that relating to property devolution family institution and burial rites is treated as being of great significance in the overall development of the tribal customary laws like any other nuba tribe the consciousness of the Ġma people of their ethos of identity marks their ferociously guarded customs and traditions prevalent up to date the book is not only a precious academic endeavor full of keen observations in depth study and analysis of tribal customary laws of property but is also a memoir for the author to commemorate formidable tribal group of the Ġma people in the nuba mountains of the sudan

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
